BOARDING HOUSE TO BE BUILT IN LOCAL AREA

There is currently an application before Council for a 25 room, two storey boarding house in 15 Leppington St. It is believed that this could be detrimental to the local area and our school given the close proximity. Local residents have been fighting this submission and are asking your help. **Important points that were shared with us are:**

- Where there are multiple adults in a household, each adult could sign their own submission form. By having separate forms, they’ll count as multiple submissions. You can use the exact same objections list.
- Friends and extended family can submit objections too. They don’t need to live in Wyong, nor do they need to even be in NSW.
- Ensure the DA is listed: DA/1484/2018.
- Ensure you indicate whether you have, or have not made any political donations (there’s a field on the form for it.)
- You only have until 15 February 2019 for the submissions to be *received* by council.

This is a short list of the objections raised which may help to act as a starting point:

- Security – Both personal and property security are of concern based on potential occupants.
- Child Safety – Preschools, primary schools, Scouts, and Guides are located nearby.
- Traffic – Leppington St is already busy. This development will add to it.
- Parking – Insufficient off-street leading to more on-street vehicles.
- Pedestrian – So little footpaths exist that people are forced to walk on the road, and at night the lighting is poor.
- Privacy – Not enough consideration has been given to the privacy of surrounding properties.
- Noise – The impact of vehicle, visitor, and services for up to 50+ people in close proximity.
- Flooding – Storm water will be diverted into inadequate drainage on surrounding properties.
- Environmental – Asbestos is a concern during demolition.

- Waste – Questionable number and type of rubbish and recycling services for up to 50+ people.
- Survey results – the bulk of the survey results indicate our community do not want this.
- Property value – while you may all be concerned about potential devaluations to your properties, unfortunately this is not something that will be considered by Council.
